

To improve malnutrition detection and care, a government-led technical working group supported by the World Health Organization (WHO) recently revised and updated the National Guideline for the Management of Acute Malnutrition.

The new guideline was launched on June 25th, 2019 by Dr Lia Tadesse, State Minister of the Federal Ministry of Health, who noted that "nutrition is now getting the attention it deserves. Launched the first ever Food and Nutrition Policy in 2018, and the guideline which is expected to benefit children and mothers greatly when properly implemented.
